Delta Epsilon Phi (National German Honor Society):

This is not yet available this year; however, basic requirements for consideration for induction are: Completion of three semesters of German with a 3.6 grade point average in German and have an overall grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Sprachfest:

We will again participate in this German version of UIL in February. Barring a scheduling conflict, you are expected to find something in which to participate as a German III Honors student. Categories are arts, drama, declamation (prose/poetry), music, oral tests, written tests, Pass Auf (quiz game), and research paper. Preparation is primarily outside of class and will require extra practice and meeting with me before contest.

GAPP (German American Partnership Program):

We have an exchange with a partner school along the German/Austrian border, Gertrud-von-le-Fort Gymnasium Oberstdorf. Exchanges typically occur Spring/Summer of even years (2020, 2022, etc.). There are informational meetings in April & September prior to an exchange year. Please pay attention to announcements and Google Classroom for those dates.
