- ❑ The state requires all graduating 12th graders to meet College or Career Military Readiness Standards
- ❑ Each student should be ready for their post secondary goals:
 - ❑ Junior college?
 - ❑ 4 year university?
 - ❑ Workforce?
 - ❑ Armed Forces?

WHAT IS CCMR?

- ❑ There are many ways to meet CCMR (we will go over the most common ways).
- ❑ All seniors must meet CCMR or will be placed in College Prep Classes 4th and 8th period =
no senior release

THE WAYS TO MEET COLLEGE CAREER READINESS

Advanced Academics

***AP Exam :** Score a **3** or higher

***Math/English Dual Credit:**
Successful completion of Math or English dual credit class (**3** hrs)

***Other Dual Credit:**
Successful completion of at least **9** hours of dual credit classes.

Test Scores

***TSI Score of:**
Math-950 or 6 on Diagnostic
ELAR-945 or 5 on Diagnostic
Write Placer-5

***SAT Score of:**
Math-530
Reading/Writing: 480

***ACT Score of:**
Math-19
Reading/Writing: 19

Certification/SPED

***Industry Based Certification (IBC)**
Earn a certification associated with a pathway.

***Special Education**
Completion of Endorsement

***College Prep Course**
Complete a Math College Prep Course
Complete an English College Prep Course

Military Enlistment:
Must provide DD4 form

TSIA2

Required Scores:

- Math- 950
- ELAR- 945
- Write Placer- 5

SAT

Required scores:

- Math- 530
- EBRW- 480

ACT

Required scores:

- Math- 19
- EBRW- 19

Composite score of
23

HOW TO MEET COLLEGE READINESS...

AP Exam

- ❑ Make a 3 or higher on an AP exam

Math/Eng Dual Credit

- ❑ Successful completion of a Math or English Dual Credit

Other DC Classes

- ❑ Successful completion of 9 hours of Dual Credit classes

HOW TO MEET CAREER READINESS...

Industry Certification

- ❑ Successfully complete the industry certification associated with your pathway
- ❑ You must have earned at least two credits in the same program of study as your certification.

Special Education

- ❑ If you are in special education, you will need to graduate with an endorsement. This does not include students in Section 504.

(Welding, Certified Medical Assistant etc...)

WHAT DO I DO NOW?

- All juniors will take the SAT this March for free!
- Sign up your student for the ACT if you'd like
- Ensure your student is in a CTE pathway and encourage them to talk to their teacher about possible certifications
- Consider having your student take Dual Credit classes over the summer or next year

WHAT IF I AM NOT CCMR BY NEXT YEAR?

- All seniors who are not on track to meet CCMR by the end of Junior year will be placed in Math College Prep and/or English College Prep
- These classes will be offered 4th and 8th period next year, which means they will not be able to have their Senior Release.
