Books: <u>My Car</u>, <u>We All Go Traveling By</u>, <u>Don't Let</u> <u>the Pigeon Drive the Bus!</u>, <u>The Wheels on the Bus</u> (You can search on youtube.com for Barefoot Books to find "We All Go Traveling By" and "The Wheels on the Bus" song books.)

Activities: Creating and describing shapes, counting and comparing groups of objects, cube train patterns (create ABA color patterns), book cover memory game, buried shapes (find and sort shapes)

You can **foster independence and personal responsibility** by teaching your child to **express emotions appropriately**. You can model feeling different emotions (naturally, as situations arise, or you can stage a moment of frustration, anger, sadness, excitedness, or happiness) and think aloud to show your child how you are processing your emotion. Ex: "Oh no! I can't find my shoe. I am so frustrated! What should I do? Should I....stand and yell?...sit and cry?....ask for help and look for it?" Students will usually react with surprise and humor when adults consider childish responses to their emotions. They will often say, "NO!" and tell the adult a good choice to make. Later, when a situation that is frustrating happens, you can say, "Remember when I was frustrated and I asked for help?" Encourage students to identify their feelings and talk about different ways to show that emotion appropriately.
